





2019 Revenues \$2,833,223

Contributions & Grants are funds donated to United Way of Central Missouri to support our mission and programs that promote health, education, financial stability and basic needs.

United Way Disaster Recovery Contributions are funds donated to United Way of Central Missouri to provide intermediate and long-term support to disaster survivors and the community.

United Way Foundation Disaster Recovery Contributions are funds donated by the United Way of Central Missouri Foundation to support intermediate and long-term disaster recovery.

Other Revenue includes income generated from the sale of promotional materials, special events and miscellaneous activities.

2019 Expenses \$2,207,398

Agency Allocations, Programs & Initiatives are costs related to funding United Way of Central Missouri's programs that promote health, education, financial stability and basic needs.

Community Support Grants are costs related to grant investments to any qualifying health and human service 501(c)(3) to address immediate, critical, unmet needs or to help with an emerging need.

General & Administrative Expenses are costs related to administering the day-to-day activities of United Way of Central Missouri.

Disaster Recovery Expenses are costs related to intermediate and long-term disaster recovery efforts.



EARLY CHILDHOOD SUCCESS

United Way of Central Missouri has championed the Early Childhood Initiative for over ten years. Through this initiative we support early childhood programs in the central Missouri area to ensure children birth through 5 years old receive quality early learning opportunities, aid parents in positive parenting practices, and support strong transition programming into kindergarten.

The Early Childhood Initiative supports early childhood providers, Born Learning materials to low-income families, the Born Learning Trail at Memorial Park, and the annual Week of the Young Child activities and events. This initiative also promotes the training and coaching of the Conscious Discipline approach to Early Childhood professionals. Conscious Discipline provides a proven and comprehensive approach to discipline that empowers parents with the selfawareness, brain information, developmental knowledge and usable skills necessary to create safe, connected, problemsolving skills.

The Early Childhood Initiative works with 9 area Childcare Centers to provide best practice sharing and networking opportunities for their early childhood professionals. Partners include Central Missouri Community Action/Head Start, Early Explorers Preschool, Jefferson City YMCA Child Development Center, Little Explorers Discovery Center, Parents-As-Teachers, Show Me Child Care Center, Southwest Early Childhood Center, Special Learning Center - Crayon Kids and The Academy of Innovative Learners.

Week of the Young Child

Week of the Young Child (WOYC) is an annual celebration sponsored by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the world's largest early childhood education association. During WOYC, we focus on the needs of young children and their families and recognize early childhood programs and services that meet those needs. To celebrate and kickoff WOYC this year, the Early Childhood Initative hosted a Dr. Seuss Birthday Bash. The event brought in more than 500 attendees who enjoyed over 28 different activities; including a bounce house, photobooth, storytelling, lab robotics and more. The event also consisted of a sock drive to instill in young children the importance of giving back, which successfully collected over 750 pairs of socks for families in need and those experiencing homelessness.





United Way 2-1-1 is here to help -- whether you're an individual looking for help for your family or a nonprofit seeking better ways to serve your clients. By simply dialing 2-1-1 (or 800-427-4626), you can make one call to find or give help. A 2-1-1 Specialist will assist in finding health and human service resources close to your home. Services include referrals for basic human needs, physical and mental health resources, support for the elderly, people with disabilities, children, youth and families, and disaster assistance. In 2019, over 2,320 calls were received from people seeking help--with 800 of those calls related to disaster. 2-1-1 played a key role as the go-to organization immediately following the tornado and subsequent flooding, providing comfort and referral information to disaster survivors. 2-1-1 is free, accessible 24/7 and completely confidential. FamilyWize is a prescription drug discount program that aims to improve lives by providing access to affordable prescription medications. Acting as a huge consumer group buying service, FamilyWize discounts and savings on medications are provided voluntarily by participating pharmacies that have agreed to provide prices similar to what they give large insurance companies and employees; therefore making prescription medications affordable for those that are struggling to pay for vital medication. 

LEADING LONG-TERM RECOVERY AFTER DISASTERS

n May 22 our lives changed forever. Many in our community will never forget huddling in our basements and closets late that night, scared and unsure what to expect as an EF-3 tornado left a path of destruction across Miller County and then tore through Cole County. Soon after mass flooding resulted in more devastation. The destruction those twin disasters left behind tested us, but the result was a community that modeled resilience and strength. We saw a remarkable community transform into something even greater. Volunteers cut up brush, picked up debris, fed and hugged total strangers.

United Way of Central Missouri is proud of the great work of the first responders, city and county personnel, health and human service agencies and faith based organizations that provided the initial boots on the ground during the days and weeks immediately following the disasters. United Way understood it was our responsibility to take a leadership role behind the scenes to mobilize volunteer deployments, serve as a location to collect supplies and redistribute them, and help secure financial and material donations from supporters to address intermediate and long-term needs for disaster survivors. Equally important was our role to serve as the convener to bring community organizations and faith based groups together to rebuild our community. Through these efforts, the Cole and Miller County Long-Term Recovery Committee has been established to provide disaster survivors the tools and resources to recover, rebuild and regain hope.

Restoring Hope After Disasters

Thanks to the incredible support and response from our community, United Way mobilized over 400 volunteers to assist with clean up two days after the tornado, and hundreds more volunteered through their churches and businesses; and many more caring community members took it upon themselves to go to the disaster impacted areas to see how they could help. In addition to the overwhelming volunteer response, community members and people outside our community donated over \$340,000 to the United Way Disaster Recovery Fund and over \$700,000 in durable goods has been donated for intermediate and long-term recovery. The Long-Term Recovery Committee is responsible for distribution of these funds and durable goods to aid disaster survivors who have exhausted all other resources available. United Way of Central Missouri is honored and proud to remain the trusted source for monetary and donation oversight and we take that responsibility very seriously. We are committed to continuing to serve alongside our community partners and caring community as we recover and rebuild.

United Way of Central Missouri hosted its annual Kids United FunFest in early October--an annual carnival free of cost to families served by United Way partner agencies--and this year extended a special welcome to families impacted by the disasters. Kids United FunFest was held at the Boys & Girls Club, an ideal location not only because many children at the Club attend the carnival, but it is also located in the heart of where some of the heaviest devastation occurred during the May 22 tornado. Hundreds of families attended the event and enjoyed activities including a bounce house, bubble machine, fire truck tours, games and more. Kids United FunFest was made possible by presenting sponsor Scholastic, and event sponsors Hawthorn Bank and Hy-Vee. United Way is grateful to these sponsors for making it possible to provide an evening of fun for families in our community.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT GRANTS

ommunity Support Grants are investments United Way of Central Missouri makes to address immediate, critical unmet needs or to help with emerging needs in the counties we serve. Open to any health and human service 501(c)(3) meeting the criteria of the grant - not just United Way partner agencies - these one-time grants give nonprofits the opportunity to start a new program, enhance an area of service or purchase needed equipment and supplies. Community Support Grants are another way we forge new partnerships, find solutions to underlying issues, and mobilize our best resources to fight against our community's most critical problems.

United Way of Central Missouri announced the opportunity for area health and human service agencies to apply for United Way Community Support Grant funding in the spring; and volunteer committees and the United Way of Central Missouri Board of Directors had vetted these requests and approved grants for 25 health and human service agencies prior to the tornado and flooding our community experienced. The letters were drafted and ready to be put in the mail the morning of May 23--the morning just after the tornado. Given the United Way had committed to the Community Support Grant funding prior to the disaster, and given the grant requests had been strongly vetted and the needs were relevant and critical, United Way staff and Board of Directors agreed it was appropriate to follow through with the grant funding.

That is when the United Way of Central Missouri Foundation stepped in. The Foundation was formed in 2003 as a safety net for our community in the event of a catastrophic event. The United Way Foundation Board unanimously agreed to step forward during this time of crisis to take \$200,000 from the Foundation and gift it to the United Way to replenish the funding spent on the Community Support Grants–allowing the United Way to utilize these funds for intermediate and long-term disaster recovery efforts.

OUR FOUNDATION



he United Way of Central Missouri Foundation operates to further the mission of the United Way of Central Missouri by maximizing fundraising potential.

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors and is a separate 501(c)(3) with the same high standards of fiscal accountability and good stewardship as the United Way of Central Missouri. The Foundation was established in 2003 to build a permanent, sustainable avenue of support for the United Way through planned giving.

Given the Foundation was formed to be a safety net for our community in times of catastrophe, immediately following the tornado and flooding, the United Way Foundation Board of Directors unanimously agreed to step forward to take \$200,000 from Foundation funds and gift it to the United Way to replenish the funds spent on Community Support Grants to twenty-five health and human service agencies. Thanks to this incredible gift, the United Way was able to provide an additional \$200,000 in disaster-related support to the community. Five health and human service agencies were awarded a portion of these funds totaling \$82,000 in disaster grant funding on November 22–exactly six months from the date of the tornado. These grants will support recovery programs and address capacity and operational needs for nonprofit health and human service agencies who felt the impact of the tornado and flooding in their day-to-day work.

In addition to disaster-related assistance, the Foundation stepped forward to help with feeding the hungry by providing funds to purchase a mobile food pantry in 2015. This mobile food pantry continues to increase food distribution to those suffering from food insecurity, and currently serves six pockets of poverty in Cole County each month. This effort was made possible through the partnership between the United Way of Central Missouri, The Food Bank for Central & Northeast Missouri and the United Way of Central Missouri Foundation.

The United Way of Central Missouri Foundation provided the financial support to purchase the truck to supplement the dedicated efforts of existing food pantries. The goal was to increase food distribution by one million pounds each year to close the gap between the level of poverty and the amount of food distributed to hungry people in Cole County. After its third year of operation, the mobile pantry has distributed an additional 744,282 pounds of food to feed hungry families in Cole County alone.

A growing number of United Way contributors' estate plans include a charitable bequest to the United Way of Central Missouri Foundation to ensure the United Way remains a vibrant resource in our community for future generations. Planned giving can be as simple as including a bequest in your will. Additionally, one-time gifts to the Foundation are a meaningful way to honor a friend or a loved one's birthday, anniversary, retirement, memorial or other special occasion.

MOBILIZING HANDRAISERS

ver 1,100 volunteers share their time and talent to fight for a brighter future for everyone in our community. Our volunteers come from all skill sets and walks of life, but what they share is an immeasurable passion for improving our community. They are bankers and public servants, teachers and business owners. They are our every day heroes.

In 2018, United Way furthered its mission to be the go-to organization for all things volunteering by launching a new volunteer platform to make volunteering easier and much more efficient for those who want to serve in our community. The platform went live just in time to organize and deploy over 300 volunteers for the annual Days of Caring event. Days of Caring is a unique twoday opportunity for hundreds of supporters in our community to see their impact firsthand by volunteering at United Way partner agencies. In 2019, the volunteer platform was essential in recruiting and deploying volunteers for disaster assistance volunteer opportunities. Thanks to the platform, over 400 volunteers were registered and ready to deploy when sites were deemed safe to help our neighbors with cleanup, and hundreds more who had signed up through the site prior to the disaster were also notified of disaster related service opportunities.

The volunteer platform is a streamlined process that allows any approved organization--not just United Way partner agencies--the opportunity to upload volunteer projects. Once projects are finalized and posted, community members can review the list of volunteer projects and sign up for the opportunity that best aligns with their passion at the time that works best for their schedule. COMMITTEES

Campaign Leadership Team: These volunteers are the face and voice of the campaign. They meet with business leaders to seek their support and assist internal campaign leaders to plan successful workplace campaigns.

Early Childhood Advisory Committee: Early Childhood professionals serve to support early childhood providers and promote early childhood programs and initiatives in the central Missouri area.

Finance & Audit Committee: These volunteers provide critical financial oversight and annually review the United Way of Central Missouri audit, IRS 990 and financial statements to make recommendations regarding agency funding and one-time grants.

Fund Allocation Committee: These volunteers meet weekly for five weeks in the spring to review partner agency funding requests for the upcoming year. The panel volunteers review the agencies in the areas of quality programming, governance, finance, administration and the impact of their services on the community. Once the review process is complete, the committee makes their recommendations for funding to the United Way Board of Directors for final approval.

Marketing Committee: These volunteers are the creative geniuses behind the campaign. They plan campaign and event strategies, the campaign video, promotions and awareness building.

Strategic Funding Committee: These volunteers provide additional financial oversight by reviewing Finance & Audit Committee recommendations, as well as overseeing fund allocation, Community Support Grants, Disaster Recovery Grants and new agency application processes.

Strategic Planning Committee: These volunteers develop a vision in concert with the needs and dynamics of the community and chart short and long-term goals for the United Way of Central Missouri through a Strategic Plan.

Women United: Women United offers an opportunity for community-minded women to show their support and further the mission of the United Way of Central Missouri. Women United is social group of giving women with a cause, and is a catalyst for change that harnesses the power and dedication of women leaders to transform our community to help people live their best possible lives.
